# First Reading:

Today, more than ever the question undoubtedly must be repeated: "Aren't they human too?" Through the whole continent of America, the indigenous have been for decades and continue to be the object of more or less systematic destruction. Their culture has been denied them, their lands have been taken over by others, and their organizations have been repressed. Real massacres are not unheard of (Guatemala, Brazil ...) The Church continues to treat the indigenous as children: efforts at an authentic inculturation of the Church in the indigenous communities have been stopped (especially since the 18<sup>th</sup> century) by the attempts to "purify" popular Christianity—a purification which is effectively a Westernization. #### **Second Reading:**

We must dare to see what is before our eyes: we must believe that it is where God seems most distant and where human beings are tempted by despair that theology may be done. Yet surely our words of hope will only have authority if they are rooted in a serious study of the Word of God and an analysis of our contemporary society. In 1511 Montesinos preached his famous sermon against oppression of the Indians and asked the question, "Are they not human beings:" Montesinos was inviting his contemporaries to open their eyes, and see the world differently. For clarity, compassion is not enough. Hard study was needed to see through the false mythologies of the conquistadores and it was the source of Las Casas' prophetic stand.
