RESPECT



Earth is a living reality which like all living entities merits respect and reverence so that it may continue to nourish, support, and sustain life.

- Use filtered or tap water rather than bottled water
- Carpool when possible
- Launder in cold water
- Never litter
- Use cloth/market bags when shopping
- Use non-toxic personal, cleaning, and laundry products
- Purchase items packaged in reusable or recyclable containers
- Choose not to use disposable plates, cups, utensils, paper products

REUSE

Earth continuously gifts us with precious commodities. It is vital to Earth that as much as possible we reuse, repurpose



and pass on to others the benefits of what has enriched us.

- Reuse paper when possible
- Repurpose books, videos, CDs, DVDs, tapes; donate to learning centers and shelters
- Reuse material that would otherwise be considered waste (grass in composting, plastic bags as trash can liners when needed, etc.
- When eating out, bring your own containers for leftovers

- Take used clothes and furniture to Goodwill, etc.
- Use rechargeable batteries
- Donate old computers, cell phones and other electronic items
- Mail or trade in used ink cartridges

RECYCLE

We have a moral responsibility to help sustain Earth for future generations. By consciously seeking to manage recyclable materials, we have a positive impact on Earth.

REVEL

- Use curbside recycling
 - Paper & cardboard (all kinds cartons, cereal boxes, etc.) newspaper, office paper, junk mail, magazines, old calendars, greeting cards
 - > Glass: all kinds of glass containers
 - Plastic containers and cups marked with a number in the little triangle (check locally which plastics are recyclable)
- <u>Do Not</u> recycle slick receipt papers due to BPA coating

REDUCE



When we reduce waste in the first place, we do not need to worry about recycling it. Changing our habits is the key. There are lots of ways to reduce our waste, save ourselves time and money and be good to Earth at the same time.

- Send e-cards
- Make homemade gifts
- Choose products with less packaging
- Use motion activated and/or timed lighting
- Turn off computer at night
- Replace light bulbs with low energy light bulbs
- Unplug electrical appliances when not in use

- Turn off ignition if you are waiting more than 10 seconds
- Lower thermostat in winter (dress in layers) and raise it in summer when using air conditioning (utilize fans)
- Use low-flow shower heads and toilets
- Sign up for paperless bills
- Minimize use of plastic, including straws

Dispose of non-recyclables in ways provided by your local community or waste hauler. These include:

- Old medications
 Decorative glass
- Old tires
 Cellophane juice containers
- Light bulbs
 Styrofoam cups and containers

Figurines/Ceramics Wax paper

- Used cooking oil Plastic rings (used with pop cans)
- Batteries all types Plastic bags (salad bags, bread wrappers)
- Plastics no recycle number

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- Plastic utensils Wax coated cardboard (frozen food boxes)
- Household hazardous wastes (oil based paint, paint thinner, automotive fluids, cleaning supplies, non-empty aerosol cans, lithium ion batteries, lawn and garden products, compact fluorescent light bulbs, electronics)
